<p>Status</p>	<p>Federal Government reserves the right to determine who is or is not a status Indian. After Bill C -31 amendments, those who lost status prior to April 1985 due to gender discriminatory provisions under the old Indian Act were entitled to apply to ISC to get their status back if they were eligible.</p> <p>However, those who got their status back got back their treaty rights¹ but not necessarily their band membership rights.</p> <p>Status Eligibility Criteria: Those eligible to apply to the Department of Indian Affairs or ISC as currently known for their status or to be registered as status Indians include:</p> <p>6(1)(a) Those who were status Indians or entitled to be status Indians just before April 17, 1985.</p> <p>6(1)(b) Members of bands which may be created in the future by the Minister under s. 17.</p> <p>6(1)(c) Those who had lost status through gender discrimination.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> i. Those who lost status because his/her mother and father's mother gained status through marriage to an Indian (i.e. those who lost status through the double mother rule). However, while they would gain status, they would have to wait two years for band membership. This time interval was intended to give bands time to enact their membership codes, which could exclude the children but not their mothers. If a code was not enacted prior to June 1987, the children would get band membership as well. ii. Indian woman who lost status through marriage to a non-Indian under 12(1)(b). iii. Person who lost status because he/she was an illegitimate child of an Indian woman and non-Indian man. iv. An Indian woman and children order enfranchised through marriage to a non-Indian (involuntary enfranchisement).

¹ Treaty rights refer to Aboriginal rights set out in a treaty. Starting in 1701, in what was to eventually become Canada, the British Crown entered treaties to encourage peaceful relations with First Nations. Some early treaties, like the Peace and Friendship Treaties in the Atlantic region, were strategic alliances. Other later treaties, such as the Numbered Treaties in Ontario, Prairies, as well as parts of the Northwest Territories (1871 to 1921), involved First Nations ceding or surrendering rights to the land in exchange for treaty rights. While no two treaties are identical, examples of treaty rights across Canada included such things as reserve lands, farming equipment and animals, annual payments, ammunition, clothing and certain rights to hunt & fish. Treaty rights are protected under S.35 of the Constitution Act, 1982 (Saskatchewan Indian, 1985).

<p>Membership</p>	<p>Many of those who lost their status due to discriminatory provisions automatically got back their membership rights and were placed on the band's membership list. Others, particularly first-generation descendants of those who got their status, had to wait two years to get their membership back. Under the proposed 1985 amendments, First Nations were allowed to take control over their own band lists and memberships by following the guidelines under the Indian Act. If they pass the law within two years of June 28, 1985, these laws will govern the membership matter for their people.</p> <p>If bands take control of their own membership, then those who did not get their membership back automatically such as first-generation descendants of Bill C-31 registrants and have to wait for two years can directly apply to the band to be admitted as members. The band then decides about membership.</p> <p>If bands do not take control of their membership within two years, then all those who were eligible to get their membership back, after two years can apply directly to ISC to be placed on the band list and thereafter receive all the rights of band membership.</p> <p>Membership Eligibility Criteria:</p>

	<p>Those persons who upon application to the federal Department are entitled to be entered on the band list immediately after April 17, 1985:</p> <p>11(1)(a) Those who were entitled to have their names on the band list prior to April 17, 1985.</p> <p>11(1)(b) Members of bands which may be created in the future.</p> <p>11(1)(c) Those who lost their status and band membership due to sexual discrimination under 6(1)(c) [the 12(1)(b)] women, involuntarily enfranchised persons, illegitimate children and those who lost status under the double mother rule.</p> <p>11(1)(d) Children born on or after April 17, 1985, both of whose parents are entitled to be registered and be entered on the band list.</p> <p>Those persons who are entitled to be added to the band list 2 years after June 1985, where the band has not taken control of its own membership and the band list remains with the federal Department:</p> <p>11(2)(a) Those who are voluntarily enfranchised for purposes of military service or to obtain employment or otherwise voluntarily enfranchised, their wives and children.</p> <p>11(2)(b) Children both of whose parents are entitled to be registered or a child one of whose parents is entitled to be registered and entitled to band membership (1st generation descendants).</p> <p>Those persons who are entitled to be added to the band list maintained by the federal Department two years after June 28, 1985, if the band council assents:</p> <p>12 (a) Those persons entitled to status but not membership in the band.</p> <p>12 (b) Those persons from another band.</p>
